MPCAC-accredited programs are required to provide program data, as listed below, each fall for the previous academic year. Additionally, programs are required to post those data on their respective websites (links to those data are provided for each program on the Status of Programs: Accredited Programs page). To enhance transparency for the public regarding information about MPCAC-accredited programs, MPCAC aggregates the data to enable comparisons of individual programs with the aggregated data across all MPCAC-accredited programs.

* Not all states have a temporary, intermediate or other preliminary license option. This is the average percentage of graduates who received a temporary license from programs that reported this outcome as relevant to their program.

** Full licensure typically takes at least 2 years to obtain; therefore, these numbers are based on those who graduated 1-3 years before the year data were collected.

*** School Counseling programs report the percent of their graduates who receive certification as school counselors.
