Additionally, programs are required to post those data on their respective websites (links to those data are provided for each program on the Status of Programs: Accredited Programs page). To enhance transparency for the public regarding information about MPCAC-accredited programs, MPCAC aggregates the data to enable comparisons of individual programs with the aggregated data across all MPCAC-accredited programs.
